



## NOTICE: Recruiting Now for 2022 NCCAOM Examination Content Development Committees

In 2022, we are recruiting NCCAOM Diplomates to serve on the Examination Content Development Committees for Acupuncture with Point Location, Biomedicine, Chinese Herbology, or Foundations of Oriental Medicine. We encourage interested candidates to apply as soon as possible as we are planning our summer meetings and will continue to recruit throughout the year.

As a first-time guest on an NCCAOM Examination Content Development Committee (ECDC), the guest will receive training on how to write high-quality, entry-level multiple-choice items for an NCCAOM examination. The guest must be able to participate in the annual in-person meeting (2.5 days) and virtual meetings (2-hours duration) throughout the year. As a guest on the ECDC, the expected commitment is one year with the possibility of being a full member with a three-year term and one reappointment.

Qualifications to serve on the NCCAOM Examination Content Development Committee are listed below:

- NCCAOM Diplomate in good standing
- Work at least an average of 20 hours per week in clinical practice and/or oversee students in a clinical setting
- Minimum of three years' work experience

Diplomates involved in developing or teaching any prep or review course or is a president, dean, or owner of institution responsible for determining academic curriculum are not eligible.

The benefits of being on an NCCAOM Examination Development Committee are:

- Attendance at annual in-person NCCAOM EDC meeting
- Enhance knowledge of the exam development process
- Build professional network while working with other NCCAOM Diplomates
- Earn Professional Development Activity (PDA) points
