



How to Apply for a Webinar or Live Streaming Course

A webinar or live streaming course is an online meeting over the internet between the participants and the instructor(s). The webinar may include two-way communication between all participants and the PDA Provider is responsible to monitor attendance via login and logout computer times. Like a distance learning course, webinars are for theory information only. Psycho-motor skills, demonstration and supervised practice are not acceptable. The amount of time the participant is in attendance and is actively learning new information determines the number of PDA points to be issued for the course.

Note: A webinar will not be published to the NCCAOM® PDA Search Engine until an event (presentation date) is posted in the course application.

Characteristics

- Verbal communication between instructor and participants
- Two-way communication
- A psycho-motor skill, demonstration or techniques may not be taught because the instructor cannot assess if the participant is correctly learning the skill.
- Teaching methods include, but are not limited to lecture, group discussion, and question and answer sessions.
- Attendance is the qualifier for issuing NCCAOM PDA points.
